

Regular Meeting November 3, 2003

A regular meeting of the Nash County Board of Commissioners was held at 10:00 AM November 3, 2003 in the Commissioners' Room at the Nash County Administration Building in Nashville, NC.

Present were Chairman J. Claude Mayo Jr., and Commissioners Jay Alford, Fred Belfield, Robbie B. Davis, Tommy May, Billy Morgan, and Lou M. Richardson.

Others present were Rosemary Dorsey, Melanie Eason, Laura Keeter, Tom Murphy, John Sharpe, Shelia Freeman, Wayne Moore, Vince Durham, Brian Brantley and Bob Murphy.

Chairman Mayo called the meeting to order and called on Lou M. Richardson for a prayer.

Chairman Mayo asked the board to consider approving the minutes.

On motion of Billy Morgan, seconded by Fred Belfield and duly passed that the minutes be approved.

Mr. Ed Browning, Asst. Chief of N.C. Office of Emergency Medical Services recognized the Nash County Emergency Medical as a Model EMS System. He presented a certification citing the significant and work that went into receiving this certificate.

Ms. Rosemary Dorsey, Planning Director presented a rezoning request by Preston Curtis to rezone approximately 2.5 acres near the intersection of NC 97 and Wilton Road, west of Samaria to A-1 (Agricultural). Ms. Dorsey stated that the Planning Board unanimously recommended approval of the request. She stated it would require a Public Hearing.

On motion of Tommy May, seconded by Lou M. Richardson and duly passed that a public hearing be called to consider rezoning request by Preston Curtis.

No one spoke during the public hearing.

On motion of Billy Morgan, seconded by Fred Belfield and duly passed that the public hearing adjourn.

Whereas, a Public Hearing of the Nash County Board of Commissioners was scheduled, advertised and conducted on November 1, 2003; and

Whereas, the Board of Commissioners heard all the evidence and arguments presented at the public hearing.

Therefore, Be It Resolved that the Nash County Board of Commissioners hereby adopts the rezoning of the above described property from R-30 to A-1.

Ms. Dorsey requested a public hearing to consider an amendment to a Conditional Use Permit for Log Home Repair and Restoration Services. The petition seeks to revise the conditions limiting the permitted uses in the existing Light Industrial Zoning to allow use of the property for a Contractor (no outside storage), General Contractor or Special Trades Contractor, and Warehouse storage of materials used in the contracting business. Ms. Dorsey stated this would be a Quasi-Judicial public hearing requiring sworn testimony.

On motion of Bill Morgan, seconded by Jay Alford and duly passed that the board go into a public hearing to consider the amendment.

No one spoke at the public hearing.

On motion of Tommy May, seconded by Billy Morgan and duly passed that the public hearing adjourn.

On motion of Lou M. Richardson, seconded by Billy Morgan and duly passed that the following resolution amending the Conditional Use Permit be approved.

storage, General Contractor or Special Trades Contractor, and Warehouse storage of
materials used in the contracting business) AT 2545 WEST HILLARDSTON ROAD**

Whereas, the Nash County Planning Board made a favorable recommendation on its October 20, 2003 regular meeting, upon petition by David and Terri Groves of Log Home Repair & Restoration Services, to amend the conditional use permit located at 2545 Hillardston Road and identified on the Nash County tax maps as a portion of parcel number 380500455349; and

Whereas, a Public Hearing of the Nash County Board of Commissioners was scheduled, advertised and conducted on November 1, 2003, and

Whereas, having heard all the evidence and arguments presented at the public hearing, the Nash County Board of Commissioners makes the following findings of fact:

1. The applicant has filed a petition for an amendment to the conditional use permit issued at 2545 West Hilliardston Road LI-CU (Sewing Operation) to LI-CU (Contractor Business with no outside storage, General Contractor or Special Trades Contractor, and Warehouse storage of materials used in the contracting business).
2. The request has been properly advertised in the Rocky Mount Telegram and all affected property owners have been notified of the hearing.
3. The request is for a change in conditions rather than a zoning district change, and the impact of the requested permitted uses is expected to be less than that of the former sewing operation, in terms of employee and freight traffic.
4. N freestanding signs and no outside storage will be allowed in order to help protect the immediate area from more incompatible aspects of some construction-related activities.
5. The proposed use will be entirely inside the existing building, in terms of materials and storage.
6. Only incidental retail sale of repair/restoration supplies are permitted, or construction of housing elements in conjunction with repair/restoration activities only (staircases, etc.)
7. A building code compliance inspection is required by a licensed architect or engineer prior to occupancy certifying that floor loads shall be compliant to store any heavy construction materials or equipment inside the building.

8. No persons appeared in opposition to the request.
9. The proposed use appears to be in harmony with the surrounding zoning, existing uses and Land Development Plan of Nash County.
10. The Nash County Planning Board unanimously recommended approval of the request.

The foregoing findings of fact will support the following conclusions:

If the conditional use district rezoning is approved subject to the conditions prescribed below it will more probably than not:

- Not endanger the public health or safety.
- Be in harmony with the area in which the property is located.
- Not injure the value of adjoining or abutting property.
- Be consistent with the Land Development Plan of Nash County.

Therefore, Be It Resolved that because the Board of Commissioners concludes that all of the general conditions precedent to the amendment of a Conditional Use Permit have been satisfied, it is ordered that the application for the amendment to the Conditional Use Permit be granted.

Be it ordained by Nash County Board of Commissioners that, pursuant to Section 13.2 of Chapter 159 of the General Statutes of North Carolina, the following Grant Project Ordinance is hereby amended:

Section 1. The project authorized is the Community Development Project described in the work statement contained in Grant Agreement 01-C-0801 between Nash County and the North Carolina Department of Commerce. This project is more familiarly known as the Nash County Scattered Site Housing Project.

Section 2. The officers of this unit are hereby directed to proceed with the grant project within the terms of the grant documents, the rules and regulations of the North Carolina Department of Commerce and the budget contained herein.

Section 5. The Finance Officer is hereby directed to maintain within the Grant Project Fund sufficient specific detailed accounting records to provide the accounting to the grantor agency required by the Grant Agreement and Federal and State regulations.

Section 6. Funds will be requisitioned from the State after submission of documentation to the County. The County upon actual receipt of CDBG funds will make disbursement of funds from the State. Compliance with all federal and state procurement regulations is required.

Section 7. The Finance Officer is directed to report quarterly on the financial status of each project element in Section 4 and on the total grant revenues received or claimed.

Section 8. The Budget Officer is directed to include a detailed analysis of past and future costs and revenues on this grant project in every budget submission made to the County.

Section 9. Copies of this Grant Project Ordinance shall be made available to the Budget Officer and the Finance Officer for direction in carrying out this project.
